# April Monthly Mission is The Music Academy @ First

This year the Music Academy @ First has really expanded it's reach. We just started the 3rd session of Beginning Piano Lessons with 4th and 5th graders from Hunt A+ Arts Elementary School. There are 32 students who have taken the Beginning Piano Lessons this year. The 4th grade and 5th grade handchime groups are preparing to play at the band and orchestra concert at Hunt Elementary on April 10. Between the fall session of handchime groups and the spring session of handchime groups at Hunt, we have had 55 students participate. Our goal this year for the number of private lessons being taught was 20 weekly lessons. This year we met and exceeded our goal with 32 weekly private lessons. Our focus for growth next year will be to increase the number of weekly private lessons being taught. Our budget this year is \$51,642 which is funded only by grants and donations (It is not part of the church budget). At this time, we have raised \$32,944 of that budget. Please consider making a difference by supporting the power of music to change lives.

The private lessons for strings and piano currently have 30 student lessons being taught (10 piano and 20 string lessons). This past week I received 5 applications for students wanting private piano lessons. These are students that previously took a session of the Hunt Beginning Piano Lessons.

- 4. Have at least 3 or 4 persons to be present to serve and greet folks as they come.





## **April Item of the Month: Household Cleaners**

The Personal Care Cupboard (The Cupboard) is stocked with many of the items that a person or family cannot get on food stamps or WIC. This includes such items as toilet paper, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, personal hygiene, laundry detergent, household



cleaners and other non-food items that people need. We currently serve 20-30 families per week.

Due to high usage, the Personal Care Cupboard needs at least 3 workers for each shift. We need workers for Wednesday from 5-6 pm and on Thursdays from 2-3 pm. Please sign up on the sheet on the bulletin board across from the Church Office.

One of the primary responsibilities of any church is to care for people. Jesus shares with the people in Matthew 25 about caring for others and ends it with, "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40). We, the First United Methodist Church at 19<sup>th</sup> and Nebraska, have found a niche that is needed in Siouxland.

Many have heard of food pantries (and we support the one at Grace United Methodist Church in Morningside) but food pantries often do not have, or have a very limited supply, of the non-food items that people need. The Personal Care Cupboard (The Cupboard) is stocked with many of the items that a person or family cannot get on food stamps or WIC. This includes such items as toilet paper, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, personal hygiene, laundry detergent, household cleaners and other non-food items that people need.

We have been serving in this ministry since March, 2010 and currently serve 20-40 families per week (or about 400 different families every 3 months). Families may come and use The Cupboard only once every 3 months.

Families are allowed 6 items per visit (an item may be a 4-roll package of toilet paper, 2 bars of soap, a container of laundry detergent, etc.)

We do not charge these families any money for this service. This ministry is supported totally by donations from churches and individuals. Churches currently in partnership with First United Methodist Church in this ministry include: First Covenant Church, Grace United Methodist Church, St. Michael's Catholic Church and Sunnybrook Church. The support comes in the physical donation of items, contributing money, and/or in volunteering time to serve the families.

The Personal Care Cupboard is located on the east side of the original church building at 1915 Nebraska Street and is handicap accessible.

Who can use The Cupboard? Anyone with a picture ID with an address on it, and they can make use of this service only once every 3 months.

Item of the Month - While we accept donations of any non-food items anytime, we have designated each month, an item which we regularly see being needed by families. We will collect the items each week in church and have a display so others can see our support.
